

Geert J.P. Savelsbergh is the Emeritus Professor of the Desmond Tutu chair for Youth, Sport and Reconciliation, former head of the Motor Learning & Performance department of the Amsterdam Movement Sciences & Institute for Brain and Behaviour at the Vrije University, Amsterdam. Between 2014-24, he was the Scientific Director of Performance for the Amsterdam Institute for Sport Science (AISS) and occupied a position as Professor of Talent Development at the Amsterdam University of Applied Science. In the period of 1991-1996, he was a research fellow of the Royal Netherland Academy of Arts and Sciences and in 2008 he received an honour doctorate of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, University of Ghent, Belgium. His research interest is in fundamental research with respect the visual regulation of movement, but also in applied research from a perception-action perspective. Concepts like anticipation, patron recognition in sports as football, field hockey tennis, golf and sailing have his attention. Specific with respect to the development of talent.

He has published over 250 papers in international peer reviewed scientific journals. He (co)-supervised 35 PhD projects in Netherlands, Australia, Belgium, United Kingdom and South-Africa and has international teaching experience Belgium, Brazil, Germany, Italy, Norway, Portugal and United Kingdom.
